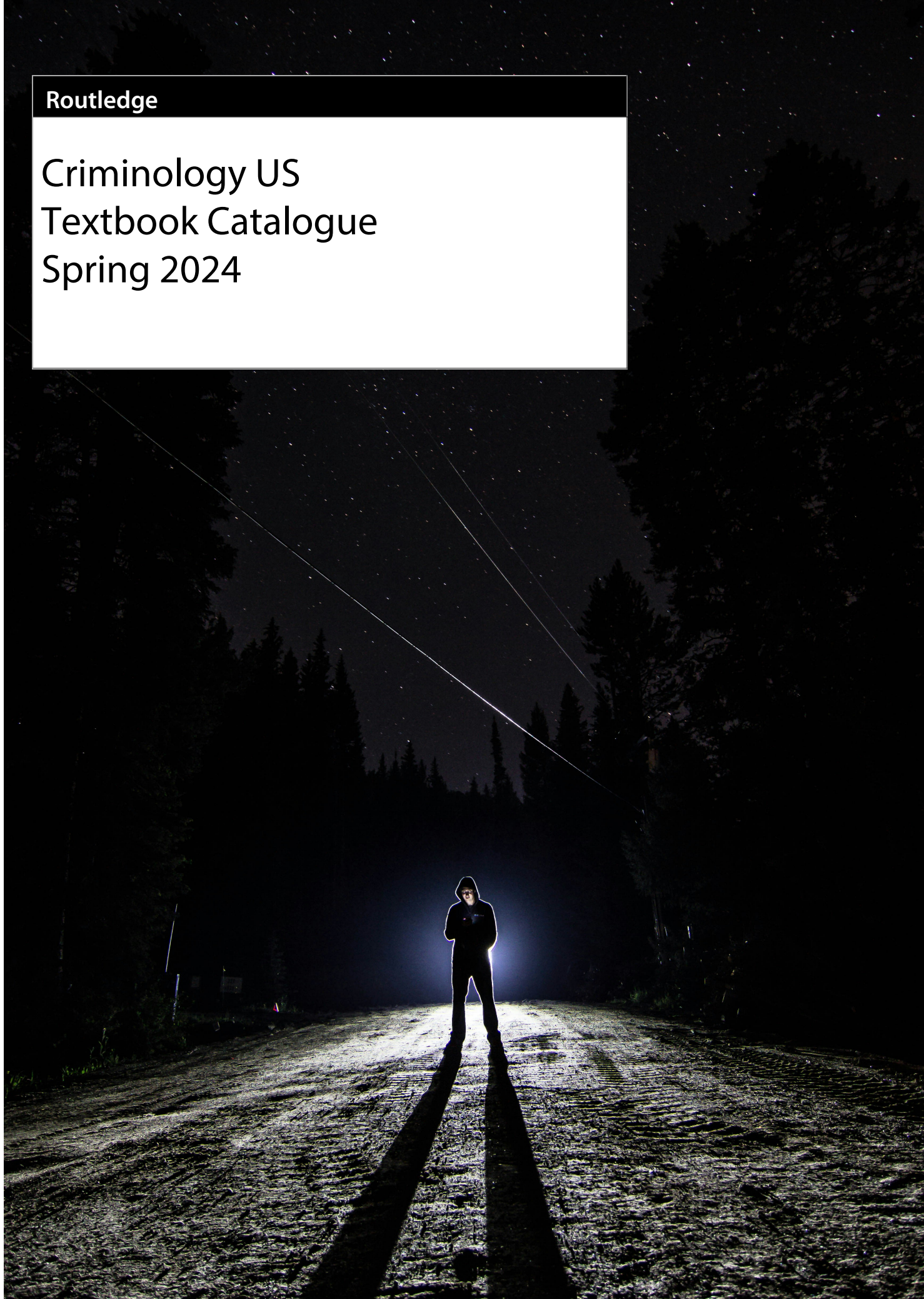

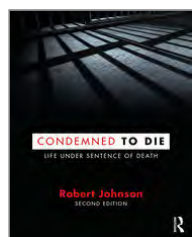

Condemned to Die is a book about life under sentence of death in American prisons. The great majority of condemned prisoners are warehoused on death rows before they are put to death. Whatever the real or imagined merits of capital punishment, there is neither a mandate nor a justification for inhumane confinement prior to imposition of sentence. Yet warehousing for death, sometimes leavened with brutality, is the universal fate of condemned prisoners in the United States, a group that comprises almost 3,000 individuals today. The enormous suffering caused by this human warehousing is the subject of this book.
